

OUTREACH

IN 2023 WE CONTRIBUTED TO GRACE'S MINISTRY & STRATEGIC PRIORITIES BY...

- Investigating options that could help Grace better understand needs in the community
- Sustaining and creating new connections in the community with the Backpack program and the Elf Network, and Christmas Musical Afternoon
- Continuing programming geared to seniors including Cooking@Grace, Line dancing and Strengthen & Stretch yoga
- Continuing to support food security by: providing space and volunteers for the weekly Food for Life food distribution program and, partnering with St Raphael's food donation project to support indigenous communities in Whale Cove

AFFIRMING TEAM

IN 2023 WE CONTRIBUTED TO GRACE'S MINISTRY & STRATEGIC PRIORITIES BY...

- Helping to create an environment of openness and learning about issues facing the 2S & LGBTQIA+ community
- Leading Grace to a vote on becoming an affirming community of faith
- Developing an Affirming Plan of Action
- Partnering with Halton PFLAG to reach into the local community

A FEW ITEMS OF GOOD NEWS FROM OUR COMMITTEE'S WORK...

- The congregational affirming vote in October 2023 was 94.3% in favour of Grace becoming an official affirming community of faith
- Grace participated in and sponsored the Halton PRIDE festival held in Milton in June 2023 alongside St. Paul's and Port Nelson. This was the first PRIDE festival in Halton organized by PFLAG
- Partnered with PFLAG who helped us with afterchurch educational workshops and services

The sale provided considerable funds for the construction of the current church building on the remaining property, as well as the construction of the housing project. The townhouses are rent-geared-to-income units, and play a part in the Community Outreach Program of the Horseshoe Falls Region of the United Church of Canada, to provide affordable housing in our area. TPCH operates in partnership with the Halton Region's Assisted Housing Programs who provide the rent subsidies for our rent-geared-to-income tenants.

TRUSTEES' MINUTES

MEETING OF THE GRACE UNITED CHURCH TRUSTEES - 17 JANUARY 2024

- 01. Update on the St. Stephen Endowment Fund
- Dave Shilton provided an update on the mortgage portion of the account. Currently the mortgage is valued at \$ 1,403,500 with an interest rate of 8.45%. The Carpenter Hospice plan to renew mortgage in April at current prime rate + 1%. The mortgage is open and the hospice will pay down the mortgage through the year. Any money received will be deposited into the investment account being managed by TD Wealth.
- Jason Aucoin from TD Wealth provided an update on the St Stephen Investment Account. The value of this account on Dec 31, 2023 was \$ 1,530,000. Interest and dividends earned in 2023 was 6.7%. A key change in 2023 was that holdings were switched from mutual funds to being a managed account where individual stocks and bonds are held. The annual fee for managing the account is 1% and investment risk tolerance is low-medium.

Total value of St Stephen Endowment Fund is \$ 3,096,364.

- Dave advised that after much discussion that the name of the fund would be re-named the Grace-St Stephen Endowment Fund. The name will change on the policy, along with a few procedural changes and will be provided to the Trustees for review & approval.
- 02. Update on the Nelson Endowment Fund
- Sheyne Fenske from RBC Wealth Management provided an update on the Nelson Fund.
 The value on this account on Dec. 31, 2023 was \$ 1,118,955. Interest and dividends earned in 2023 was 11.1 %. The annual

fee for managing the account is 1.35% and investment risk tolerance is moderate.

- The base value of the Nelson Fund is \$ 1,000,000. Per discussion with Sandy we agreed that \$ 100,000 could be made available to support capital improvement projects.
- After discussion we agreed that the name of Nelson Endowment Fund would be changed to Grace-Nelson Capital Improvement Fund. The name will change on the policy, along with a few procedural changes and will be provided to the Trustees for review & approval.
- We had a discussion on the mortgage we hold on the Palermo UC manse. The mortgage is valued at \$ 119,000 and is due to be renewed on August 31, 2025. Interest rate is currently set at 0% so Palermo UC do not make payments.

The Finance Committee is pleased to provide our 2023 Financial results & the 2024 Budget

Financial Results 2023

Results for 2023 show a "Net Profit" of \$8,193. The result is favourable to our 2023 Budget by \$22,034. There are a number of reasons for this positive result:

Rental and Fundraising Income: Were in excess of budget by \$8,503. Thank you to those responsible for maximizing our building rental opportunities and the hard-working fundraising teams.

Other Misc. Receipts: Exceeded our budget forecast with the help of a large donation from the W4 Group.

Payroll: Expenses were favourable to budget as our office administrator did not assume her position until a couple of months into 2023.

Loan Forgiveness: Our loan forgiveness includes \$20,000 in loan principal and interest of \$1,700 from a GIC where the funds were invested for the past year.

Other notes:

In spite of a successful Stewardship campaign envelope givings were below our budget. While we did see an increase in givings from the congregation that came from the Stewardship campaign, this was offset by the departure of a number of envelope givers.

Budget 2024

The Grace United Church 2024 Budget projects a Net Loss of \$30,030. This shortfall will be covered from surplus funds in the Operating account. The projected Net Loss is attributable to a number of factors.

- Envelope giving is not increasing at the rate which is needed
- We do not have the benefit of a loan forgiveness amount of \$21,700 in 2024
- Payroll costs are expected to increase by \$13,848

Financial Summary (cont.)

While the 2024 Budget shortfall of \$30,030 will be covered from prior year surpluses, this projected deficit is of concern.

The main reason for the projected shortfall is that Envelope givings have remained flat for the past four years.

There are a number of steps the Finance Committee will undertake in 2024 to address our projected shortfall.

- Undertake additional analysis of our envelope givings to identify reasons for our flat growth.
- Look to reach out to the growing number of people watching our services on-line and solicit their financial support.
- Undertake a review of our rental rates to determine if we are maximizing the amount or rental income being generated.

It is important to note, while Grace United Church is blessed to have two Endowment Funds, neither can provide funding to support the operational costs of Grace. We will keep the congregation apprised of our efforts throughout the year with regular financial updates.

Finally, I want to acknowledge the hard work of Finance committee members

Sandy Mckeown, Treasurer and John Allchin, Donation Steward. Both roles require a lot of time and dedication. We are pleased to provide the annual report for the Nelson Endowment Fund.

The name of Nelson Endowment Fund is proposed to be changed in 2024 to the Grace-Nelson Capital Improvement Fund. The name would change on the policy, along with a few procedural changes. The name change will reflect the current purpose of the account which is to fund property and communication equipment upgrades.

The value on this account on December 31, 2023 was \$1,118,955. Interest earned in 2023 was 11.1%. The base value of the Nelson Fund is \$1,000,000. With approval of Trustees we confirmed to the Board and to the Property Committee that \$100,000 would be made available to support capital improvement projects. This is in addition to the \$20,000 in the General Account that was provided by the Fund for contingency during the pandemic.
